Špela Drnovšek Zorko is a Project Associate Professor in the Graduate School of Intercultural Studies and a member of the Research Institute for Promoting Intercultural Studies (Promis) at Kobe University. After obtaining her PhD in Anthropology at SOAS, University of London, she held a Leverhulme Trust Early Career Fellowship at the University of Warwick and a JSPS Postdoctoral Fellowship at Waseda University, as well as visiting fellowships at the Catholic University Eichstätt-Ingolstadt, the Leibniz Institute for Regional Geography, and the University of Warwick. Her work on diasporic narratives and migrants' encounters with race has appeared in journals including *Ethnic and Racial Studies*, *Comparative Migration Studies*, and *The Sociological Review*. Her current research centres on questions of cultural translation, racialization, and East-West imaginaries in contexts of migration.
