Based on the JSPS KAKEN project "Migration, Sex Work, and Human Trafficking: narratives and networks", Hélène Le Bail will discuss how to design and implement a research methodology in a context of political and academic polarization on the issue of prostitution. The long-standing debate has been renewed since the beginning of the 2000s due to the growing number of migrants involved in the sex industry and to the advance of pro-abolitionist regulations in several countries. Doing research on migration and prostitution/sex work supposes for researchers to consider ones own position within the debate and to propose methodology taking into account the diversity of migrant sex workers' situations.
