Environmental resolution mechanisms beyond the nation state. A comparative analysis of the implementation of court judgements and managerial agreements (国を超えた環境問題解決メカニズムの比較分析)

新川匠郎研究室ではコルカーチ. アンドレアス氏が取り組まれている「国際的 な環境問題解決メカニズムの比較研究」プロジェクトに関するオープンセミ ナー(英語)を開催します。

Niikawa Sho Lab organizes an open seminar of Dr. Corcaci. He compares the implementation of decisions on environmental conflicts across judgements from European and international courts and managerial decisions from implementation committees. The puzzle that implementation occurs despite different 'resolution mechanisms' is investigated by making use of existing research on EU policy implementation to assess preferences, legitimacy, and sanctioning mechanisms as explanatory conditions. Under which conditions does effective implementation of European and international environmental court judgments and managerial decisions occur? To answer this question, he outlines a concept structural framework based on the management and enforcement approaches, following a conjunctural logic. He applies this framework by comparing implementation processes resulting from various court and committee decisions relating to hazardous waste and chemicals, water resource management, and protection of the marine environment. The seminar will be held in English.
